GRANT AMOUNT: \$5,000

DEADLINE: January 16, 2017 | 5:00pm

ELIGIBILITY

- The grant is intended to offset any expenses related to a project, opportunity, or materials that will enhance an artist's overall body of work or career.
- Applicant must be a current resident of Shelby County, Tennessee (for at least six months).
- The ArtsAccelerator Grant will support visual artists working in any media, including but not limited to 2D and 3D work, photography, installation art, performance art, video (except film intended for cinematic release) or social practice.
- Applicant may NOT be currently enrolled in a degree-granting program or its equivalent.
- Individuals are eligible to receive only one grant every five years.
- Artist Advisory Council members within two years of rolling off the board are not eligible.



Grant Eligibility

Applicant must be a **current resident of Shelby County, Tennessee** (for at least six months).
Applicant may **NOT** be currently enrolled in a degree-granting program or its equivalent.
Individuals are eligible to receive only **one grant every five years**.
Artist Advisory Council members within two years of rolling off the board are not eligible.

Eligible Funding

The ArtsAccelerator Grant is intended to **offset any expenses** related to a project or opportunity that will enhance an artist's overall body of work or career.

Examples include

- Expenses related to a scheduled exhibition
- Expenses for travel or research that is specifically related to the proposal
- Workshop fees
- Research and development
- Feature-length or short works of video or film



- Strength of the artist's work
- Clear and decisively written proposal
- Generally brief and to the point
- Aligns with the parameters of the grant
- Successfully explains why this grant is important for you now
- Successfully shows how the grant can push the boundaries of your practice in a significant way

Competitive Application

Writing is an essential part of a good portfolio.

Tips from the book ART/WORK – to help you start writing about your work and your intentions, start answering a series of questions, even if they're obvious.

Writing Sample



If awarded the Arts Accelerator grant I will paint ten large-scale abstract oil paintings, approximately 60" x 48". These paintings will represent a considerable jump in scale from those in my current body of work, which measure 20" x 16".

Creatively, this scale shift reflects a new goal for my work – to simultaneously command attention while maintaining intimacy. I hope, among other things, that the viewer is physically engulfed by the painting. I am interested in testing out my ideas about how the pacing of my marks effects the pacing of the viewers' experience. The smaller scale confines my gestures and mark making, while a larger format may allow the experience to be felt physically and not just perceived visually.

My painting process requires sustained intense focus. I have found that a painting session at least three hours long is necessary to fully engage a 20" x 16" canvas and make any significant progress. One of the main obstacles to creating large-scale paintings is the need to extend this time in order to wrestle with such a large surface. Therefore, I propose to also use the grant funds to pay for childcare that would extend some of my workdays and allow continuous eight-hour stretches of studio time.

Receiving an Arts Accelerator grant at this time, facilitating the purchase of both materials and time, would help me make a very significant transition in my practice from being a part-time painter raising a family to being a full-time artist.

Completing this body of work will not only give me the opportunity to thoroughly pursue the ideas that I have already introduced but it will also demonstrate my commitment to being a professional painter.




Media Requirements

10 samples of your art work

Work must be completed within the last three years

Include relevant information pertaining to each work: Title, Date Completed, Dimensions (if applicable) and Medium

Limit the length of your videos to 3 minutes and be sure they are not password protected



Competitive Application



Take great photos of your artwork

- Cohesiveness - choose strong images that show consistency and represent your work the best
- 10 Images, can include details of your work or you can also submit drawings/plans for the direction in which you want to go
- Your 10 Images can be diverse (medium) but think about what ties it all together - convey your artistic vision
- Submit the best examples of your work (Photography, Video) - don't let sloppy documentation hurt your chances



Artistic Merit (60%)

Potential impact of the grant on the artist's career or body of work (30%)

Grant Clarity (10%)

Awarded Grant

75% of funding will be paid out in the beginning of the grant cycle

Can an artist apply as a group or a team?

Yes, however, artists may only submit one grant application. If you apply for a grant as a group or team you may not submit an additional application as an individual artist.

If I am awarded a grant, is it considered taxable income?

Grant monies are taxable as ordinary income. Please consult a qualified tax advisor for further information.

Is preference given to emerging or established artists?

Artists have new and evolving challenges as they move through their career. The ArtsAccelerator Fund does not give preference to emerging, mid-career or established artists. Competitive applications will demonstrate the impact of the proposal on the artist's career at the current point in time.

What if I don't have access to a computer?

Crosstown Arts' Digital Lab is a new 6-station computer lab located at 430 N. Cleveland supporting Memphis' creative community by providing artists and musicians full access to industry standard art and music-making technology. The Mac-based lab offers the full Adobe Creative Suite of software, as well as Avid's Pro Tools, to artists and musicians working at any level of expertise on their creative projects.
